### **Contacting 999 emergency services by text**

Dialling 999 for the emergency services is always stressful. If you are deaf or have a speech impairment it is doubly so, "What if I can't hear them?" or "What if they can't understand me?".

Now we are able to contact 999 by text, but you will have to register your phone with them first. It is a simple process:

- Text the word 'Register' to 999.
- You will receive a text about the services.
- When you have read the messages, text 'Yes' back to 999.
- They will reply, telling you that your phone is registered or if there is a problem with your registration.

You will be able to contact Police, Fire Service, Ambulance or Coast Guard with greater confidence.

In an emergency you will need to text 999 with the following information:

- Which service Fire, Ambulance, Police or Coastguard?
- What Briefly, what is the problem.
- Where Give name of road and town, plus other information such as house number or nearby landmarks or main roads.
- A text relay assistant will speak your message to the 999 advisor, their reply will be sent back to you as a text.

#### **New Patient Participation Group members wanted**

A Patient Participation Group (PPG) consists of voluntary patient representatives and Practice staff who meet regularly to consider improvements in the service provision supplied by Wallingbrook Health Group (WHG) to patients. ## **How can the Patient Care Coordinators help you?**

We now have a new Patient Care Coordinator (PCC) role within WHG. The role has been created to assist patient communication with their GP. The PCCs will assist you by booking your routine appointments with your usual GP. They will assist the GPs referring patients to the hospital, ensuring all the necessary paperwork is in place. PCCs may be asked by the usual GP to phone patients to monitor progress after an appointment or hospital discharge. The coordinators will assist their GP with continuity of care work. The PCCs for the GPs are: Jess Powell - Dr Wielink and Dr Sherlock, Sarah Rowley - Dr Burke, Dr Gosrani and Dr Starks, Sam Bunton - Dr Guildford and Dr Wilson-Smith. When telephoning to book an appointment with your usual GP, select option 1 followed by option 2 and then select your usual GP's PCC.
